Every year, students in grades 4 and 5 have the opportunity to take part in the instrumental music program. This program gives students the chance to learn a wind band instrument as part of the school day. Students participating in band will have a short lesson every 1-2 weeks during the school day. As students progress, they may also participate in ensemble experiences as reopening circumstances permit.

The options for instrument study are flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion (bells and drum). Students have been seeing demonstrations of these instruments in their music classes. There is a list on the attached paper to indicate which instrument(s) your child is interested in.

All students will need an instrument in order to participate in lessons and band. **The best way to ensure that your child is playing their choice of instrument is to provide your own instrument through purchase or rental.** The school district has a number of school instruments available to borrow for the school year at no charge. These instruments are of varying condition and limited variety. Students needing a school instrument may not receive their first choice, but every effort will be made to offer students an instrument to study.

If you are interested in having your child join the instrumental music program, please fill out the attached paper as soon as possible. Once instruments are received, students will be scheduled for instrument lessons.

### Important Questions about the Instrumental Music Program

#### What instruments can my child learn?

The main options for instrument study are flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion (bells and drum). Students wishing to play percussion will spend half of their lessons on bells/mallet percussion and the remaining half on snare drum.

Other band instruments include the French horn, baritone/euphonium, tuba, oboe, and bassoon. I do not normally recommend starting on these instruments due to size, difficulty, and availability, but could offer lessons on them if a family has the instrument already.

### How can I get an instrument?

Local music stores offer opportunities to rent beginner level instruments for the school year. This is a popular option for families interested in music, as the rental cost for a year is normally substantially lower than the cost for purchasing a quality beginner instrument. If you are interested in purchasing an instrument, please contact me for a list of reliable brands.

If you already own a band instrument, I am happy to play test the instrument to see if any minor repairs are needed. Please contact me to arrange a day for this so that best practices for preventing COVID can be followed.

The school has a number of instruments available to borrow at no cost. If you wish to be considered for use of a school instrument, please understand that your child may not get her or his first choice of instrument due to the number of instruments we have.

The best way to ensure your child learns the instrument of their choice is to provide one through purchase or rental.

## Is there anything other than an instrument needed?

All instrumental students, regardless of where they get their instrument, will need a lesson book and necessary instrument accessories (reeds, cleaning materials, etc.). A list of these accessories will be provided once your instrument is selected. It is also highly recommended that students have a music stand at home for practice.

## What are the time and practice obligations?

Students who participate in the instrumental music program will have a twenty minute lesson each 1-2 weeks and, potentially, a thirty minute group rehearsal each week. *It is the responsibility of the student to cover work missed during lesson and rehearsal time*. Additionally, students participating in the band program will be expected to practice, outside of school, for five days a week. Finally, students will be expected to attend all instrumental performances scheduled through the year. These could be live or virtual events as circumstances dictate.
