The following are facts and statistics on substance use in the United States in 2013, the most recent year for NSDUH survey.

- Illicit drug use in the United States has been increasing.
- Marijuana use has increased since 2007.
- Methamphetamine use was higher in 2013, with 595,000 current users, compared with 353,000 users in 2010.
- Most people use drugs for the first time when they are teenagers.
- More than half of new illicit drug users begin with marijuana.
- Drug use is highest among people in their late teens and twenties.
- Drug use is increasing among people in their fifties and early sixties.
