

PROMOTION POLICY FOR GRADE 6

To be promoted to the next higher grade, students in Grades 6 must meet the following requirements:

- Pass three (3) of the four (4) major subjects
- (English, Math, Social Studies and Science)
- Students will be required to retake the failed course or pass that course in summer school
- If a student fails one class, summer school is recommended but not required.
- If a student fails two classes, summer school is required.

Sample Schedule

- 1. English 6
- 2. Math 6
- 3. Social Studies 6
- 4. Science 6
- 5. FACS 6 (Either Q1, Q2 or Q3, Q4)
- 6. Art 6 (Either Q1, Q2 or Q3, Q4)
- 7. Reading 6 (or Achieve 3000/Reading 1)
- 8. General Music OR Chorus OR Jr. High Band (A OR B Days)
- 9. P.E (A or B Days)
- 10. Lunch
- 11. *Study Hall* (Not Guaranteed)

This is a required list of classes 6th grade students are supposed to take. This is subjected to change and there might be new classes offered or removed. Those with a Resource Room with be added by the School Counselor.


Tentative Schedule for 6th Grade

- 1. P.E (A days)/General Music or Band or Chorus (B days)
- 2. Math 6
- 3. Science
- 4. FACS 6 (Q1, Q2) then Art 6 (Q3, Q4)
- 5. Reading 6 (or Achieve 3000/Reading 1)
- 6. Lunch
- 7. Social Studies 6
- 8. English 6
- 9. Study Hall or Resource Room or ELA/Math Labs

Course time will vary based off of available and final scheduling of classes. Reminder this is a tentative schedule and can change. The Counselor will place you in Resource Room depending on IEP.
